

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE:

The Venue is only 2 - 3 miles from the Sky Blue Connexion, near Coventry which is just off the **A45/A46** easily accessible from the **M6, M69, M1/M45** and **M42**.

From M6: exit at Junction 2 and take the A46 towards Warwick. FOLLOW THE AIRPORT SIGNS for several miles when Baginton signs appear. The road follows the airport perimeter and takes you into Baginton Village, as you reach the junction in the village the Hall is straight cross the road on the left of the green.

From M69: continue to end of motorway on to the A46 towards Warwick. FOLLOW THE AIRPORT SIGNS for several miles when Baginton signs appear. The road follows the airport perimeter and takes you into Baginton Village, as you reach the junction in the village the Hall is straight cross the road on the left of the green.

From M1 Northbound, exit at Junction 17 on to **M45** and then take the A45 towards Coventry. At the junction of A46 turn towards Baginton FOLLOWING THE AIRPORT SIGNS. The road follows the airport perimeter and takes you into Baginton Village, as you reach the junction in the village the Hall is straight cross the road on the left of the green.

From M42 exit at Junction 6 on to the A45 towards Coventry. Follow signs to Airport and Baginton. If you enter Baginton from the west (ie without seeing the airport perimeter) then turn RIGHT at mini roundabout in the centre of the village and the Hall is on your left - if you have come along the airport perimeter (as with other directions above) then go straight across the junction and the Hall is on the left.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

The word 'dog' includes both sexes

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a Member of the Club.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 20th March 2020

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes, but when entering for Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) **Withdrawal.** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F (1) 19

(2) **Transfer** (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class which is over age but under 12 calendar months, 18 calendar months or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any other reason than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

With these provisos the following are the Definitions of Classes:

Puppy - For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

Junior - For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

Novice - For dogs which have not won a CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

Graduate - For dogs which have not won a CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open classes, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Limit - For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Open: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

Veteran: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

Special Triers: For dogs or owners/handlers who have never won a CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or any award that counts towards the title of Champion in any country.

Not for Competition: For all exhibits entering the show Not for Competition. Puppies aged 4 - 6 months may be entered NFC at the owner's responsibility provided they are fully vaccinated.

SHOW REGULATIONS

- 1 The show will open at 9.00 am
- 2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will commence at 9.30 am
- 4 Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5 Entry Fees: **Members:** First entry for each dog £5.00, second and subsequent entries with the same dog £1.00, **Non-members:** First entry for each dog £6.00, second and subsequent entries with the same dog £1.00. **Not for Competition** £2.00 per dog.
- 6 Prize Money - 1st £3.00, 2nd £2.00, 3rd £1.00 paid at the show
- 7 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition. Fully vaccinated Puppies aged 4 - 6 months may be entered Not for Competition.
- 9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 10 **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11 **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16 **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts of travelling to and while at a KC licenced events.
 - i) When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - ii) If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - iii) The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink
 - iv) Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog
 - v) When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle
 - vi) Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade, for example a large umbrella, and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated
 - vii) Avoid taking part in un-necessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

- 17 Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 18 No modifications will be made to the Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
- 19 The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show and exhibitors are reminded that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 20 Exhibitors Passes will not be sent. Please enclose a stamped addressed postcard if acknowledgement of receipt of entries is required.
- 21 Dog Fouling and Grooming waste - any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licenced Show within the Licenced Venue and within the environs of that event, including car/caravan parks and approaches. Any organisation holding a Kennel Club licenced event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling/waste.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licenced event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing can be done except
 - (a) operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee,
 - (b) the removal of dew claws of any breed,
 - (c) operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated, in the opinion of the General Committee, to deceive.
- 4 The General Committee, without previous notice, may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual relating to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events:

- i) When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- ii) If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- iii) The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink
- iv) Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog
- v) When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle
